Burn Center Visits Inspire Giving

North Carolina's electric cooperatives have long been supporters of the North Carolina Jaycee Burn Center in Chapel Hill. The center provides state-of-the-art burn treatment and rehabilitation for patients who have had severe and life-threatening burns and provides burn prevention education. Each year, the general managers from North Carolina's Touchstone Energy cooperatives hold a golf tournament to finance the sponsorship of the Burn Center and its programs.

As you can see, Randolph EMC is no stranger to the Burn Center. When a Randolph EMC lineman recently spent time there during the holidays, the cooperative's employees and directors were inspired to show a little extra support for the center.

With little time to spare, members of the co-op family rallied together to collect donations for the patients and staff who would not be able to spend Christmas at home.

A total of \$3,071 was collected from employees and directors and was used to provide fruitcakes for staff members, gift cards for each patient's family, and various toys and craft kits for the kids spending their holiday in a hospital room. A group of employees

gathered at the Burn Center on Christmas day to deliver the gifts.

REMC had a remainder of \$1,160 after purchasing the gifts. That money was donated to the N.C. Jaycee Burn Center Family Assistance Fund, which helps the families of long-term patients with travel and other expenses.

"We just wanted to do something to help make these folks' holidays a little bit brighter," said Dale Lambert, REMC's Chief Executive Officer. "So many of our employees visited the Burn Center and came back saying, 'What can we do to show our appreciation and support?' Well, once our employees and directors found out they had the opportunity to help, we were overwhelmed with the response we got. I think this is a great example of the cooperative spirit at work."

Revealing R-values

When the weather's brisk, it's smart to wear a coat. Your home needs the same kind of protection, too—insulation to keep cold air out and warm air in. Just as a coat closet features thin jackets for fall and heavy jackets for winter, different types of



insulation, ranked by R-value, exist to keep your home comfortable and your electric bills affordable.

R-value reflects the ability of insulation and other parts of your home, like windows, to resist the transfer of heat. The rating depends on material, thickness, and density, and a higher R-value indicates more effective insulation. Multiple layers of insulation may be combined for a higher cumulative R-value.

Just as fur keeps animals warm, insulation holds heat in (or out) of a building. Fur is a collection of hair—tiny hollow cylinders. Air fills the cylinders and spaces in-between. The smaller the space for air in between the cylinders and the more spaces there are (longer hair equals more space), the greater the insulation.

Building insulation works on the same principle. Fiberglass insulation, for example, exists as a collection of hollow fiberglass cylinders.

Be careful to preserve the air—the bulk of your home's protection—when installing insulation. When an installer squeezes 3 in. of insulation into a 1-in. space, critical air pockets are eliminated. Insulation must be installed correctly to maximize protection—and electric bill savings.

Keep Air Flowing for Savings

Should I close off my vents and rooms to save energy?

Years ago, people would save energy by closing off portions of their homes that were not being used. This occurred usually in the winter when people would huddle around a fireplace or wood stove and close off other non-heated rooms.

While this may have worked with older, noninsulated homes, it doesn't work with today's forced air heating and cooling systems. A 2003 study by the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory found that closing registers actually led to *increased* energy use for a typical California house because closing off registers increased pressure for the whole system, causing air leakage in the ducts located outside the conditioned space.

To save energy on heating and cooling costs, check your insulation levels and consider sealing the areas around your home's exterior.
